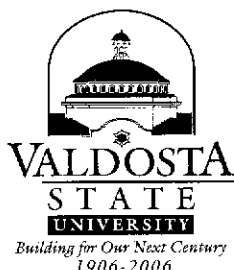

This memo seeks your assistance in effecting a degree major name change from **Administrative Services (ADS)** to **Office Administration and Technology (OAT)**. The reasons for this request are as follows:

- Research revealed only one other college/university in the nation that offers the ADS degree as we know it and a few institutions which offer two-year ADS certificates. As a result, our students who, for whatever reason, must transfer to another university have discovered that they have no equivalent degree program into which to transfer. Some of our current students have expressed anxiety regarding this matter. In addition, calls and e-mails from former students also address this concern.
- The search for "Office Administration" or "Office Administration and Technology" degree programs returned many matches involving colleges/universities in many cities and states which offer the OA or OAT degree. I believe we owe it to our students to aid them in degree reciprocity.
- The national trend among other schools/colleges that offer an ADS degree is to offer it as a graduate-level degree program to certify K-12 school administrators.
- Finally, it would facilitate our students' job search if they could more easily match their degree title with local and national vacancy listings and degree requirements.




The AAS in Dental Hygiene is a Cooperative Degree Program between Valdosta State University (VSU) and Valdosta Technical College (VTC). VTC's Dental Hygiene Program recently received reaccreditation from the American Dental Association and the Commission of Dental Accreditation. One recommendation resulting from the accreditation review was that the "general education content must include oral and written communications, psychology and sociology". We therefore request to add ACED 2050 – Communications for the Workplace, PSYC 2500 – Fundamentals of Psychology, and SOCI 1101 – Introduction to Sociology to the degree program. USG Academic Policy 303.05 specifies a general operating policy #4 that says, "...students in such programs will not be required to complete more general education than the minimum standards set by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools for credits to be taught by the degree-granting institution, unless professional accreditation standards for the particular program require additional related academic studies". Additionally moving BIOL 2651, BIOL 2652 and BIOL 2900 from Area D to Area F is more appropriate since these Biology courses are not listed as acceptable in Area D but are still required in the Dental Hygiene Program. Please see attached email confirming the appropriateness of these courses by the VTC Dental Hygiene Degree Coordinator.

Specialist programs are mandated to be performance based and developed around local school system partnerships. This new program was developed to meet the recently adopted PSC standards and BOR principles for new program approval. It has been reviewed by the leadership program advisory group composed of public school system superintendents from the three Regional Educational Service Agencies in Valdosta State University's 41 county service area.
