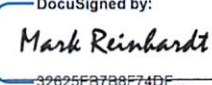

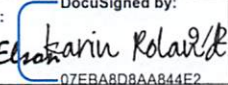

## Agreement for Dual Degree Program

Statement of Intent: The intent of the dual degree program is between the School of Nursing (SON) within the College of Nursing and Health Sciences (CONHS) and the Langdale College of Business Administration. The program is a dual Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program and Master's of Business Administration (MBA) program. The program will consist of 15 MBA credit hours in combination with 15 credit hours of the DNP program of study, both given in an online format. The program will require nine pre-requisite hours of finance management, accounting, and management. The pre-requisite courses are self-paced and are offered at <https://ivysoftware.com> and must be completed before beginning the MBA portion of the program. The DNP program is currently 38 hours (5 semesters), and the MBA is 15 hours (with the dual program). The DNP students currently have six hours devoted to electives; therefore, the dual student will only need to add nine hours to their overall plan of study.

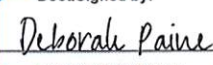


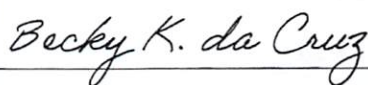
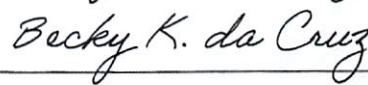
