ATTENDANCE:

It is solely your responsibility to make arrangements for a make-up exam; I will not hunt you down. You must notify me of any missed exams immediately (within 24 hours) and make arrangements within three (3) business days to take a make-up. If you have not contacted me within 24 hours of missing the exam you will receive a 0% for that exam. Make up exams will be more difficult and may consist of oral, short answer, and/or essay type questions at my discretion.

ASSIGNMENTS/EXTRA-CREDIT POLICY:

- Assignments: Several assignments will be given throughout the semester. You will be awarded credit based on content of these pieces. Your responses must be more than "cut-and-paste" blurbs, and you MUST cite all of your references (when necessary)—journals, newspapers, magazines, books, television series. If a citation is required and you do not provide one, you will **not** receive credit. Assignment due dates will be given and no assignment will be accepted "late".
- **Quizzes** will be short answer, fill-in-the-blank, true/false or multiple choice. They will be given at any point during the class. FYI--You will have either a quiz or an exam each time we meet.

- Exams: All exams will be a mixture of multiple choice, T/F, fill in the blank, short answer and diagrams. All exams will be approximately 100-125 questions and you will have approximately 90 minutes to complete them. All personal belongings must be left at the front of the classroom and you may only have a writing utensil and calculator at your desk. Exams will cover information any and all information you received during that section.
- **Research Paper:** One research paper will be required this semester. Topic TBA. Your paper is due on or before the last class day. Your research paper will be graded partially using the Safe Assign program, which detects plagiarism. By taking this course, you agree that all required course work may be subject to submission for textual similarity review to SafeAssign, a tool within BlazeVIEW. - **Five (5)** additional points come from attendance. If you are here every day of the semester, you will *automatically* earn 5 points. Beware....attendance will be taken at random times during the class. If you leave class before I check, or you come in later, you will not be given a point. Take home point: be here on time, and don't leave until class is dismissed.
