Noted VSU Economist Addresses Chamber Board

r. Cynthia Tori, an economics professor at the Langdale College of Business at VSU, shared her thoughts with the Chamber Board on the recent media story regarding Valdosta's low ranking among Metro Areas nationwide on two important measures of community economic health. Dr. Tori noted that the Valdosta Metro Area was ranked third from the bottom among the 365 Metro Areas in the U.S. on median family income and percent of population below poverty. She noted that the three more rural counties (i.e., Brooks, Lanier and Echols) that are included in the Valdosta Metro Area are not to blame for our low ranking, as their combined populations make up only 20% of the total population of the Metro Area. Moreover,

Lanier County's median family income is actually higher than Lowndes County's, and Brooks and Lanier Counties' poverty rates are lower than Lowndes County's poverty rate.



Dr. Tori also referenced a report called "Lowndes County By The Numbers" that is produced by the College of Business each year for the Chamber's Annual Economic Summit, which shows Lowndes County ranks I I th among the I5 peer counties in the southeastern U.S. on I I measures of community economic health. Comparing Lowndes County with the communities that rank #1 and #2, it's clear that they have a smaller portion of their labor forces involved in retail and hospitality industry jobs than we do, and a higher portion working in higher wage manufacturing. As the Chamber has been saying for years, it's the mix of jobs that matters.

Asked if these statistics should be cause for concern in our community, Dr. Tori said, "If we are satisfied with these rankings, then we can continue the status quo. If we want our community to do better, we will have to identify a community-wide strategy to accomplish this."
