SOLIS is now pleased to announce the call for nominations for the 2022-2023 academic year for the following positions.

- The **SOLIS President** serves as ex officio member on the Department of Library and Information Studies Advisory Board. SOLIS presidential responsibilities include attendance (either in-person or virtually) at monthly DLIS faculty meetings, receipt of minutes of those meetings (excluding executive session items), and dissemination of those minutes to the SOLIS general membership.
- The **SOLIS Vice President** or another appropriate designee from the SOLIS Executive Board represents SOLIS on the DLIS Curriculum Committee. Vice Presidential responsibilities include attendance (either in-person or virtually) at DLIS curriculum meetings, receipt of minutes of those meetings (excluding executive session items), and dissemination of those minutes to the SOLIS general membership.
- The **Communications Officer** serves as the editor of the SOLIS newsletter and facilitates other media-driven forms of student outreach.
- The **Secretary/Treasurer** is responsible for taking notes during SOLIS meetings, reviewing SOLIS financial information, and disseminating the meeting minutes and financial information to the SOLIS general membership.
- The **Advisory Board** will consist of at least 6 members.

Together, the officers and the advisory board members will comprise the SOLIS Executive Board with full voting rights for each member of the Board.
